## Becoming a More Empowered Patient

- Write down your questions ahead of time.
  - Be Specific
  - Speak Up
- ASK your questions
  - o Do I really need this test of procedure?
  - o What are the downsides?
  - o Are there simpler, safer options?
  - o What happens if I do nothing?
  - o How much does it cost?
- In the end, be comfortable with your decisions about your health care.



We have chosen a second <u>video</u> by the National Patient Safety Foundation: <u>AskMe3</u>, to share with you. Here, you learn that there are three important questions to ask your doctor whenever you see him or her. When these questions are answered, you will find yourself more informed and better able to engage in your care.

- What is my main problem?
- What is my plan of care what do I need to do for my main problem?
- Why is it important for me to do this?
